Increasingly, businesses are committing to sustainability, are adopting cleaner and greener business models and supply chains. The 'greentech' sector already generates £1.15bn per annum for the county and contributes 7% of local GDP. However, rapidly changing business landscape presents a challenge to these active and innovative businesses who currently don't have the resources to monitor or benefit from all the new opportunities. To fill this gap, Oxfordshire Greentech, a new business forum, is being created.
